### **Traffic issues and parking at The Patch School**

For over twenty years The Patch School has discussed, designed and implemented strategies to deal with the problem of insufficient parking on the school site. School council and local government recognise the issues around congestion and its impact on our neighbours, walker safety and movement through the school but whilst the situation is not ideal, if we all work together we have a very safe and efficient system for dropping off and picking up our students.

In the mornings, students are required to be at school by 8.50am. There is a teacher from the Year I/2 level who is rostered on duty to ensure that the traffic is moving smoothly and children are exiting their cars safely. This means all children step out onto the footpath and no-one leaves their car unattended. Sometimes young children take longer to do this and we need to exercise patience and tolerance despite the inconvenience.

In the afternoon, it is by nature much busier. Students should be at the drop off area by 3.30pm. They are organised into their year levels with the preps at the bottom of the hill and the 5/6's at the top near the shelter shed. Siblings are required to stand together with the class of the youngest child.

The majority of teachers are on site in the afternoon. Students are asked to look up the hill for their expectant vehicle, to walk along the yellow painted line down the hill to their vehicle when it arrives, to keep social chatter to a minimum and to abstain from organising play events whilst getting in and out of cars.

It is a busy but efficient system when all students are up on time, parents drive slowly and safely and continue around the circuit if their child/children are not in attendance. Please remind your child to move quickly to their car, wait in their correct position and to be at the drop off on time. The entire school can be collected within 10 minutes if parents only need to go around the drive once.

Parking is in limited supply. The gravel carpark is a relatively new addition to provide additional parking for parents on the higher area, and staff in the lower area (below chain gate). This lower area is treacherous in the wetter months and we have had many cars bogged when they park on the grass.

The gravel surface requires ongoing maintenance and drainage issues are problematic but it does provide much needed car parking space and most users recognise that due to the congestion within the parking area and on the road, it is best to use this area if you can wait until last to leave.

The parking behind the hall is reserved for the kinder and OSHC staff and the lower carpark is reserved for staff in the year 5/6 level and art/music. As you are aware, the main staff car park is a no go zone for students.

Please respect these designated areas as they serve a specific need and purpose.

Finally, we wish to acknowledge the tolerance and patience of all our parents and friends who use our drop off and parking areas appropriately. You set a fine example and demonstrate to your children, and others, the safe behaviours we wish to embed in everyone.



Cooper was entered into the Beef Cattle Young Paraders Competition. This competition is open to men and women in the cattle industry aged 25 and under. The competitors are judged on their handling skills, so it has nothing to do with the cattle. They need to have their animal prepared and clean to go into the show ring, they need to have excellent control over their animal, regardless of its behaviour, they need to be presented in a certain way in terms of their dress and have the animals leather halter and brass clean. As well as trying to keep their animal under control, they need to have their eyes on the judge at all times, no matter where he/she is standing, or how their animal is behaving (but you must have control whilst doing this).

The competitors come out in different "classes", so both Bella and Cooper came first in their respective classes (with the judge later commenting that either could easily come and work for him at any price they name!!). At the end of all the classes, all first ribbon winners reenter the show ring to compete against each other and the Champion handler is selected.

This is an extremely great achievement for Cooper to win, as he was competing against young men and women in their 20's who work with cattle as their full time job 7 days a week and have many more years' experience than him. It was also challenging for him, as he lead an animal he had never worked, or bonded with before his class, and then with a second unfamiliar animal in the Championship class. He managed to calm each animal down, and had them trusting him the whole time, as he walked, very relaxed yet with an air of confidence around the show ring. By winning this title, gives him extra credit to his name, and he will receive extra work for himself and his own stud (Cooperay Livestock) where people pay him to work with and show their cattle.

He received his ribbons, a glass trophy, \$150 gift voucher to spend at Pakenham produce, some cash and about \$500 worth of products (drenching guns, drench, work shirts etc) We are extremely proud of how hard he works, and how confident and dedicated he is to doing what he loves.

All of his winning money he banks, to support his business, Cooperay Livestock, so that he can eventually expand into breeding his cattle and specialising in AI, preg testing and embryo flushing.

### CHAPERONE REQUIRED THE 28th ASIAN PACIFIC CHILDRENS CONVENTION, FUKUOKA JAPAN - JULY 2016

Each year, 6 children are selected by the Australia Japan Society of Victoria (AJSV) to attend the Asian Pacific Children's Convention (APCC) in Fukuoka, Japan. A chaperone is required to assist the AJSV Liaison officer with the briefing and preparations for the visit as well as attending the convention. The chaperone will be responsible for the care of the children, both while travelling and in Japan (approx. two weeks), assisted by a Peace Ambassador. Whilst in Japan, the chaperone will fully participate in the APCC program including homestay with a Japanese family, school visit, camp and other events/activities organised by the APCC/host families. There is no opportunity for independent travel or sightseeing during the convention. Meals, accommodation and transport whilst in Japan are provided.

Final dates of this year's convention will not be known until late May however, it will be from approximately 10 July to 24 July (approx.) and does not fully coincide with Australian school holidays. It should be noted that this is a voluntary position and it is anticipated that the selected person will have experience with children, particularly those in upper primary school.

Airfares and travel insurance will be covered by AJSV but AJSV membership, spending money, passports etc are the responsibility of the selected person. A Working with Children's check will be required prior to the trip. Japanese language will be an advantage but is not essential but interest in Japan is essential!

Expressions of interest in this position should be forwarded, together with a brief resume to the Australia Japan Society of Victoria office no later than 4.00pm on Monday, March 7th, 2016. Applications should include relevant experience with upper Primary School aged children, details of past travel including Japan as well as any other relevant qualifications. You should also provide your reasons for wishing to be part of the program. Short listed applicants will be invited to an interview with members of AJSV Committee of Management. Interviews will be arranged following this date. Male and female applicants are encouraged as the six children consist of three boys and three girls.


