We have had a jammed packed few weeks with a Department of Education Strategic Review, visits from parliamentary officials and our Assistant Regional Director, nomination for awards, children auditioning for the Victorian State School Spectacular, and a Curriculum and Planning Day with Tom Brunzell, to mention a few.

I would like to thank the parents for completing our online survey to help shape the direction of our school over the next 4 years, and our leadership team and students who reported on the day. Held over 4 weeks our review was intensive and will allow us to focus on Literacy and Numeracy and developing our Welfare and community links even further. Our report is yet to be completed and presented to School Council but we are certainly looking forward to 2017.

Our year 5/6 students had visits from our local members Honourable Member Minister James Merlino and Speaker of the House Tony Smith.
