# SCHOOL COUNCIL NEWS

We held our first WebEx School Council meeting on Tuesday evening and it was wonderful to hear from our councilors of how they are coping in their new "teaching" role. The following is a snapshot of some of the members' thoughts on remote learning so far:

All parents and staff agree that the remote learning has been a great experience because it is so comprehensive and well designed.

Parents are feeling both over-whelmed from being teachers to sometimes multiple children, and working from home etc, yet supported with warmth.

Teachers are making every effort to work with parents and children's different needs from their online meetings, to voice recordings of the tasks, to tech support, emotional support, printing out daily worksheets for parents who are struggling with time/tech management, to supporting work/school free days when needed. The PPS has shown immense support, and the children are thoroughly enjoying each point of contact.

Parents expressed immense gratitude for the teachers and heart that the community has offered. We are seeing children working well in this new frame of learning, and finding a place with teacher and parent input.
