From the Principal...

Thought for the week:

"One looks back with appreciation to the brilliant teachers, but with gratitude to those who touched our human feelings. The curriculum is so much necessary raw material, but warmth is the vital element for the growing plant and for the soul of the child."

Carl Jung

The teacher's core business is to teach. We see that every day. Reading, writing, spelling, maths, Japanese, Philosophy, Science, Art, Music - the list goes on.

The things that teachers do every day that we don't see are just as important, sometimes more so. It's conflict resolution, building resilience, modelling respect and self-management, boosting confidence and encouraging esteem, helping to solve social and family issues – this list is endless, harder to mark and the results are not reportable. Positive self-esteem is one of the building blocks of school success; it provides a firm foundation for learning.

For many students, self-confidence is a natural personality trait: you either have it or you don't. Confident learners tend to speak more and know how to get their point across. For students who aren't so confident, learning new material can feel like swimming upstream. They will question their abilities and shy away from communication.

A student's self-esteem has a significant impact on almost everything they do -- on the way they engage in activities, deal with challenges and interact with others. Self-esteem also can have a marked effect on academic performance. Low self-esteem can lessen a student's desire to learn, their ability to focus, and their willingness to take risks. The challenge in working with children with low self-esteem is to restore their belief in themselves, so they persevere in the face of academic challenges. Educators shape self-esteem every day, in the normal course of interacting with their students. Although you cannot teach a student to feel good about themselves, you can nurture their self-esteem through a continual process of encouragement and support.

Here at The Patch, we have a range of programs from Prep to 6 that help consolidate this nurturing.

- Philosophy which focuses on our values of respect and responsibility
- Friendship circle, circle time and class meetings where children discuss and problem solve issues that are occurring within their grade.
- Reach Rookies with a focus on understanding who we are
- Standing Tall a program developed by Yale to incorporate being able to stand tall with integrity and confidence
- Taming of the Butterflies a public speaking course designed to give students confidence in their ability to talk and present to others
- Empower for boys and girls learning how to deal with conflict around groups and friendships

- KidsMatter which will be launched at our Bushdance.
- Jody Yandle in the role of counsellor and service guidance.

We are working hard towards helping your child be the best they can be now and long past graduation from primary school. Teaching the whole child is our privilege and our joy.

KeepCup comes to The Patch for 3/4 Sustainability

Isaac Livett, the Account Manager at KeepCup Australia visited this morning's assembly to present our grade ¾ sustainability classes with a donation. This is their speech.

"Thank you, Isaac, for being here today to present us with these KeepCups.

Sustainability is a really important issue that we all study here at The Patch. We are trying to reduce the amount of waste that we make because waste is terrible for our environment. Waste goes to landfill which never breaks down. Ever. We went to the rubbish tip for an excursion in Sustainability and we saw what happens to all of our rubbish. It was horrible. Hot chocolates from our lunch orders come in throw away cups. That's wasteful and we had an idea about how to change this.

We thought about this problem and decided that the only way to keep having hot chocolates and also reduce the amount of rubbish coming into or school was to use Keep Cups for our hot chocolates.

We wrote a letter to the KeepCup company, on behalf of planet Earth, to ask if they would be able to generously supply our school with KeepCups for us to use for our hot chocolates instead of the disposable ones that end up in landfill. Our teachers all use KeepCups when they are out on yard duty with their coffee and tea. They look so colourful and fun and we know that they can be re-used a hundred million thousand times which drastically reduces landfill.

We asked for 25 cups because The Patch Store told us that they usually have around 25 kids from our school order hot chocolates each lunch order day in the winter. We rang the KeepCup company and read them our letter over the phone. Then we emailed it to them as well.

Keep Cup wrote back and said that they were touched by the effort and the passion our grade has demonstrated and they were really pleased to tell us that they would be happy to donate 25 KeepCups to our school. These cups will live at The Patch Store and when you order a hot chocolate with your lunch order, it will come in one of these awesome re-usable cups. When the bell goes to go out for lunch, please rinse out your cups in your classroom and then bring it up to the office and put it in the Keep Cup basket. Our grade will wash the cups and return them to the store.

We have worked out that we can save over 1000 throw away cups from landfill every winter!

Thank you so much to Keep Cup for your generosity and donating all of these cups to our school. You have helped to make a huge difference to the amount of waste coming into our school and ending up in landfill."



QkR Tips!

For any of you who do not have access to a tablet or smart phone and cannot access the app, head to the school website (School Life tab) where there is information about how to access the web based version.

School lunch orders are now available for order on Qkr! This will be a great time saver, no longer will you have to scrounge for loose change in the morning rush! Lunch order days are still Monday, Wednesday and Friday. When you log on to Qkr simply click on The Patch Store then select the day you are ordering lunch for, then scroll through the products and select what you'd like. You will need to order individually for each child.

Remember that if you have ordered lunch on QkR, there is no need to place a written order in your child's lunch order basket. As with any new process, there may be a few hiccups to begin with but the system is constantly being refined and your feedback is valued.

What is SchoolMate? SchoolMate is an app for Victorian parents to help them understand what their kids are learning and get more involved in their child's education.

Who is SchoolMate for? Parents of students from prep to Year 10 in Victorian government schools.

Can parents of children in Catholic and independent schools use SchoolMate? Parents with children at Catholic schools can also use SchoolMate as their schools also follow the AusVELS Victorian school curriculum. Parents with children at Independent schools should check with their principal or teacher about how closely their school follows the AusVELS curriculum.

Where can I get SchoolMate? You can download it now for free in the App store and in Google Play. Just search for 'SchoolMate'.

Does SchoolMate work on all phones and tablets? SchoolMate works on all iPhone 4s, 5s and 6s and all recent iPads. It also works on all current Android phones and tablets.

What will I find in SchoolMate?

SchoolMate will:

- Show parents a snapshot of what their children are learning in each subject at each year level according to the Victorian curriculum (AusVELS)
- Provide tips as to what they can do at home to help their kids in the best way possible
- Suggested related apps, books, events and activities relevant to each subject area.

Will SchoolMate tell me everything about what my children are learning at school? No. SchoolMate is a snapshot of the school curriculum (AusVELS) which our school uses as the basis for the learning programs we deliver every day. Parents should always talk to their child's teacher with any questions about what their child is learning.

Who created SchoolMate? The Department of Education and Training's Digital Comms team, with lots of help from the Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority and dozens of educators from the Victorian teaching subject associations.





Financial Assistance

Information for Parents

Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund (CSEF)

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund will ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities.

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors, excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works and sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance will be paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student will be:

- \$125 for primary school students
- \$225 for secondary school students.
