What we are learning......

Literacy

We have been writing in our gratitude books about what we are grateful for and about Smiling Minds. We have been writing recipes for the Food Fest and have been writing stories. We are all trying really hard to get our Pen Licences and some of us already have! We have been doing book circle. In book circle we read an agreed amount of a book and have a role (like Question Writer, Discussion Leader and Summariser.) We also record what's going through our heads, in independent reading.

Numeracy and STEM

In numeracy we have been working on fractions. We've been learning about equivalent fractions, adding fractions up and making fraction number lines. We've been learning what a right angle, and acute angle and an obtuse angle is. We need to know what a right angle is so we can use this skill to help work out where the water is in the wetlands.

Winter Concert

In the winter concert , which is being held in the hall, some people are showing their musical talents and things that they are good at. Some people are singing while others are playing the ukulele and other instruments. Parents are welcome to attend.

PE

We have started to learn how to play hockey. First we learnt the skill involved such as passing and dribbling. Before we can play a game, we need to work on developing our skills.
