Reading and Writing


In Grades 1 and 2 our focus this term is on narratives. Narratives are one of the earliest types of writing and reading that

students do.
This is because
humans explain
their lives and
the lives of
others in
terms of stories, and
through read-



ing and writing a range of narratives, they are open to other ways of being, thinking and describing the world around them. Narratives also encourage creativity and imagination. In both reading and writing, we are looking at the purpose and structure of narratives (A beginning that introduces characters and a setting; a middle where a problem occurs and the end where the problem is resolved and the characters change). By regularly reading quality narratives and discussing their features, we are able to extend students' range and quality of writing.

Maths Year 2



MULTIPLICATION DIVISION

skills they are developing in class!

In Maths, we focussing on multiplication and division-We are learning that multiplication involves joining groups together (e·g· 2 groups of $4 = 2 \times 4 = 8$) and strategies for solving such problems e·g· repeated addition, skip counting and using number facts· We are also learning that division is the opposite of multiplication and involves equal sharing (e·g· share 20 lollies with $4 \text{ kids} = 20 \div 4 = 5$) and strategies for solving such problems e·g· repeated subtraction and using number facts·


Practising counting by 2s, 5s, 10s, 3s and other numbers your child is keen to count by (e·g· 6s and 9s) will be greatly beneficial for both multiplication and division· Practising multiplication facts like 2 \times 5; 5 \times 5; 3 \times 2; 10 \times 6 etc· is also useful· Don't forget your child has a log-on for Mathletics and doing these activities allows them to practise the

Maths Year One

We are looking again at using our counting strategies particularly counting by twos, fives and tens starting at various starting points. This provides the basis of multiplication

and division for grade 2 and above. We will also be looking at practical ways to model sharing between small groups, looking to see that the sharing is fair and whether there are any remainders.


The Grade 1's have been looking at Time, looking at the hands on the clock, understanding that the hands point to hours and minutes and beginning to read time to half hours on both digital and analogue clocks. We have also looked at the seasons on the calendar.



STEM

This term in STEM we are focussing on physical science.

The Year 1's are investigating light and sound. Light and sound surround us and allow us to communicate with each other. We are exploring different sources and types of light and sound and how light and sound affect what we think and do, and how we feel.



The Year 2s are investigating physical forces – push and pull. Forces are at work in everything we do—we push to open doors, and pull to tie ropes. Gravity pulls on things to make them fall down or to keep them down. Understanding forces helps us to understand the world around us.



TERRACYCLE

We are still collecting oral care and beauty products for Terracycle. TerraCycle is a company "Eliminating the Idea of Waste®" by recycling the non-recyclable in order to divert millions of items of waste from landfills and incinerators each month. As well as helping reduce landfill, we as a school re-

ceive 0.02c per item collected, so the more items collected the better. So tell your friends, family and neighbours!

At the entrance to the main building/office of the school there are two large tubs for collection. We accept the following items:

Colgate Oral care recycling program acceptable items: All toothpaste tubes and caps, toothbrushes, toothbrush and toothpaste tube outer packaging, floss containers. Please note: Electronic toothbrushes and electronic toothbrush parts are not recyclable through this program.

Beauty products recycling program acceptable items: Cosmetics packaging (e.g. used lipstick and lip gloss, mascara, eye shadow, bronzer, foundation, eyeliner, eye shadow, lip liner, and concealer packaging), Hair care packaging (e.g. used shampoo and conditioner bottles and caps, hair gel tubes and caps, hair spray and hair treatment packaging), Skin care packaging (e.g. lip balm, face moisturiser, face and body wash soap dispensers and tubes, body and hand lotion dispensers and tubes and shaving foam packaging).



Please divert the items from your landfill bin and instead bring them to school and place them in the appropriate tub. Thank you!

We also look at needs and wants and our take-away message for our youngest students is "Speed to your needs, wait for your wants!".

As we are also looking to make items for our festival next term, we would love to have someone who is running a small business come and tell the students how this is (simply). 15 - 30 minutes is enough time if you can spare it.

Premier's Reading Challenge

The Premier's Reading Challenge is now in its last month. We have 21 students who have completed the challenge. 


If Kids Ran the World
