Hi Everyone!

The sun is out, the birds are singing in the trees and life at The Patch is looking pretty amazing! I'm so lucky to be walking into such a wonderful environment each day. Add to it the fantastic students, families and staff that are so welcoming, and you get a beautiful school. I can see why so many parents are ex-Patchies themselves!

Today I received feedback that our Preps and Year 1/2s have been some of the best groups they've experienced at Monbulk Pool for their efficiency in transitioning in and out. Likewise, our Year 3/4s were fantastic last week. As an adult I find the humidity and chlorine of an indoor pool tiring, so the students have done incredibly well to go to sessions 5 days in a row and still be engaged and enthusiastic in the classrooms. I think there will be a number of students needing a well-deserved sleep-in tomorrow!

It is now less than two weeks until our inaugural Patchmas celebration evening! I'm excited for us to celebrate our kids and acknowledge everyone who has contributed to our beautiful school. Finally, I wanted to give you an update on our building works. The kinder roof will now be replaced from Monday 4th December, with kinder students being located in our library and tutoring room for the final 2 weeks of their term. It is then expected that the middle section of our Main Building roof will be replaced from early Term 1. The tendering process is almost complete for the builders in regards to our big build grant. The first stage of proposed works is to remove our existing 1/2 classrooms and to replace it with a new 4 classroom learning centre, as well as a number of outdoor spaces and a new toilet block. This stage of works will likely take 12 months for completion. Slowly but surely, it is making progress and we will get to benefit from the new, open spaces in the years to come.



If you are new to our school and have not completed an application form you will need to do so.

A reminder to eligible parents of students that are transitioning to secondary school that you will need to complete a new application form and submit it with their new school.



FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- . \$150 for primary school students
- · \$250 for secondary school students

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

Y1/2 ART & STEM

This term, students Yr1/2 have been attending combined Art and STEM sessions to learn about birds. It has been wonderful to be outside bird watching. Students have become very observant about different species of bird found at The Patch Primary School and are now experts at identfying birds by their size, habitat and calls. Students have been recording data about birds they have seen and heard on our learning walks and have spent time sketching the different habitats found at our school.

In STEM, students have learnt about bird life cycles, habitats, nest building, diets and anatomy and in art, students have been learning how to accurately draw different species of birds and have sculpted models of birds using clay.


