# PatchFest24

## What students need to bring on the day:

### 1. Tokens

Students can buy each other's market items and activities using tokens. You will be able to purchase them on QKR in the lead up to the event, or with cash or EFTPOS on the day. Keep in mind some of the activities will be free.

### 2. Colour run clothes

Students will need to wear a white t-shirt for the Colour Fun Run. Plus shorts, socks and runners you don't mind getting covered in colour powder! You might want to bring a change of clothes. You can also donate a spare white t-shirts for those who don't have one (just hand them in to Kim at the office).

## Parent Information:

- There will be teachers in attendance, but from school finish time your child will be your responsibility
- All food, drink and general market stalls will accept cash or EFTPOS, with ATMs available around the grounds.
- Please leave dogs and pets at home.
- Please do not bring your own alcohol. Our wine and beer tent will have all you need.
- We need volunteers! There will be short volunteer shifts throughout the event as well as during the set up and pack down. You'll be able to register your interest soon. For now save the date.
- Family and friends can also run in the Colour Fun Run! Register via Qkr! from March 12th. \$5 per registration.
- A giant mural will be created before and after the event on our rebound wall near the middle playground. We are currently determining how to build some fundraising opportunities into this project. Stay tuned!
- OSHClub will operate as normal. Students in aftercare will still attend the whole school concert supervised by an OSHClub team member.
- Parking will be available on the oval and surrounding streets.
- School toilets inside the main building will be open as well as those in the car park. Signage applies.




