What we are learning in Literacy

In Reading we have been concentrating on finding the heart of a story or a poem. We ask ourselves, "Why did the author write this book or poem? The children are given time every day to change their readers. Please ensure you are hearing your children read every night. During our Reader's Workshops, we are focusing on our comprehension strategies. We ask questions and make connections when we read and follow up with written work and reflection time to check that children are tracking their thinking as they read. We have been reading and writing poetry and the children have written some wonderful poems. We have focused on alliteration, adjectives and syllables and we are doing some Japanese Haiku poetry next week.

Spelling

We are working through the coloured spelling lists. Testing and practice happen on Wednesday and Thursday afternoons and spelling lists come home weekly. Thankyou SOOOO much to those parents who are helping out with the spelling testing each week. We couldn't do it without you!

Numeracy

We have been busy exploring shape in our numeracy workshops. We need to know the names and properties of shapes in our world. Do you remember what a rhombus or a parallelogram are ? Ask your childrenthey know. This week we have looked at symmetry and the children have enjoyed looking for symmetry in their environment and in shapes. We enjoyed painting on one side of a piece of paper and printing it to make a perfectly symmetrical picture.
