## Message from Alesha

#### Beautiful Patch Community,

I just wanted to say a huge thank you for all the support, kind messages and love I have felt from everyone as I move into the Assistant Principal role in 2025. I can't tell you how much it means to me to have your support and trust.

My role will look different to Michelle's role, as it will take on a wellbeing lens but I hope to continue Michelle's amazing ability to bring community together and to keep giving our students their voice and agency. I am very aware I have big shoes to fill, and I don't take that lightly. I know I will have a lot to learn and I am really looking forward all the new challenges that will come with the role. The first of which will be to undertake the training to become our schools Mental Health and Wellbeing Leader. I will also have Haley and Hayden come with me to undertake this training to be part of this team.

The MHWL will work across the school to implement a whole-school approach to mental health and wellbeing.

#### This includes:

- Building the capacity of school staff to identify and support students with mental health concerns.
- Supporting the school to create clear referral pathways and connect to local services for students identified as needing further assessment and intervention.
- Coordinating targeted mental health support for students by working with school staff, school community members and external agencies.
- Implementing effective mental health strategies aligned with social and emotional learning and embedding a whole-school approach to wellbeing and learning initiatives.

It is a fantastic initiative that all primary schools will be implementing, and I look forward to having more capacity to help our students in this area.

I am also beyond thrilled that I will still be teaching Preps for two days a week, as most of you know I adore every second with those tiny humans, it just fills my bucket daily. It is also a wonderful way for me to have strong connections with all the students and families within the school. It ensures that in a leadership capacity I am still connected completely to the classroom and the needs of our students and teachers.

As I said in my interview, I wouldn't have applied for the role if I didn't feel my values and vision aligned with Jim's vision for the school. -Council contacted and fences repaired on oval


-Raised the need for lines to be repainted on basketball court (will happen next year) once building works are complete.

#### **School Saving Bonus**

The \$400 School Saving Bonus will be provided directly to the school. Families will receive an email from the Department of Education with their \$400 School Saving Bonus information and access to an online system. Families can choose how to use and allocate the \$400 bonus - on school activities, to purchase uniforms, on school camps/excursions, swimming and sporting programs and graduations to name a few.

From mid Oct to late Nov parents and carers will receive the first School Saving Bonus email from the Department of Education, confirming contact details. Please keep an eye out for this email - it may go to your junk/spam folder.

Then on Nov 26, 27 & 28 a second email will come out from the Department of Education with your unique \$400 bonus code. Families will then be able to start spending with suppliers in store and online and allocating to school activities.



#### STEM UPDATE

In our 5/6 STEM classes we are designing a garden area.

Kim and Michelle have helped the three 5/6 classes measure, soil test and design this garden and soon we will start to plant.

Our project started in Term 2 and our first step was to find the area and perimeter for the garden!

Each student paired up and measured each side of it. It was important to know this so that we could tell just how much room we had for plants.

Our 2nd step was soil testing, we needed to do this so we could tell what soil we had and what plants worked in this soil.

Then we began to design our garden, we started by looking in books about plants and garden magazines for inspiration. Then everyone would find a group of friends and design what we would want our dream garden to look like!

Once everyone had their designs we voted on our favourite ones and what our most popular features for the garden were!

During the garden project I have most enjoyed measuring, soil testing (pH testing) and designing the garden site. I have learnt about soil testing, how to use a compasses and analysis. 
