Conversations

Conversations require self-disclosure, which can be challenging for some children. Good conversationalists give of themselves, but also take an interest in the other person. Many children forget that good conversations are two way events, and tend to focus solely on themselves. Children within conversations need to learn to ask good or interesting questions; to take turns when speaking and to show you are listening by making eye contact and not interrupting.

Tips:

- **1.** Hold conversations with your children in a variety of situations, including mealtime so they experience the conventions of conversation. They will also learn how to start a conversation by talking with you.
- **2.** Talk about conversation starters with your children. These often involve questions that are related to the situation or that both of you have an interest in.
- **3.** Encourage children to stay in conversations, or even start up conversations with adults.


This will provide terrific experience in asking and responding to questions as well as making eye contact and showing interest.

Absences - Good News!

Forty-five of our students will be receiving a surprise letter in the mail this week congratulating them on having achieved 100 % attendance up until May 27th (when all the calculations were made).

Another forty-two students will also receive a personalised letter congratulating them on achieving 99% attendance during the same period of time.

These eighty-seven children will also receive a special certificate with their reports stating that they have achieved 99% or 100% attendance and this is very well deserved.

Attendance is something we still need to continue to focus on at The Patch this year as it was identified in our School Review as an area needing improvement.

It is a fact that there is a strong correlation between poor performance at school and a high number of days absent so there is a need to be aware of how many days of absence have mounted up over Semester 1.

With reports this semester, each child in the school will receive an Attendance Record set out in 5 categories in terms of his/her attendance.

If he/she is in either of the top two sections (meaning they have had fairly regular attendances) there is reason to celebrate because academically and socially conditions are ideal for them to succeed to the best of their abilities.

If placed in any of the lower three sections of this Attendance Record however, learning and the ability to reach potential is at risk (as described on the sheet itself).

Of course we understand that children get ill (particularly in the Winter months) and need days off from school to recover. Please remember to keep your child home if he/she is really sick as they should not be at school if unwell. It is still important, however, to be aware of how these days can mount up and how they can affect your child's learning.

Our main concerns revolve around the children who have ongoing days absent from school that are not always related to illness. We encourage you to look at the percentage of time your child has been absent from school. If you know that your child has had one or more bouts of illness during the first two terms of this year then you can put this into proper perspective and know that their absences have been unavoidable.

All this information about number of days absent and percentage of time present at school will be included with reports. I hope you will find it useful.

School Start Time

To enable teachers to begin their learning time at 9am, we ask that students are in their classroom **from 8.50am** wherever possible. This allows students to organise themselves and be ready for effective learning at 9am.

Without this settling- in period, valuable learning time is taken up and we can't take advantage of the full teaching block.

You may have noticed that we also minimise disruptions from phone calls and PA announcements during the two learning blocks prior to lunchtime to maximise the effectiveness of this time. Students that arrive at school **after 9am** will be marked as 'late arrivals' and require a parent to sign them in at the Office and provide the class teacher with the white slip.

If you need to drop your child at school early, please remember that we offer a fantastic before school care program which costs \$12 (\$13 from Term 3) including breakfast or \$6 without (before deducting any Child Care Benefit).
