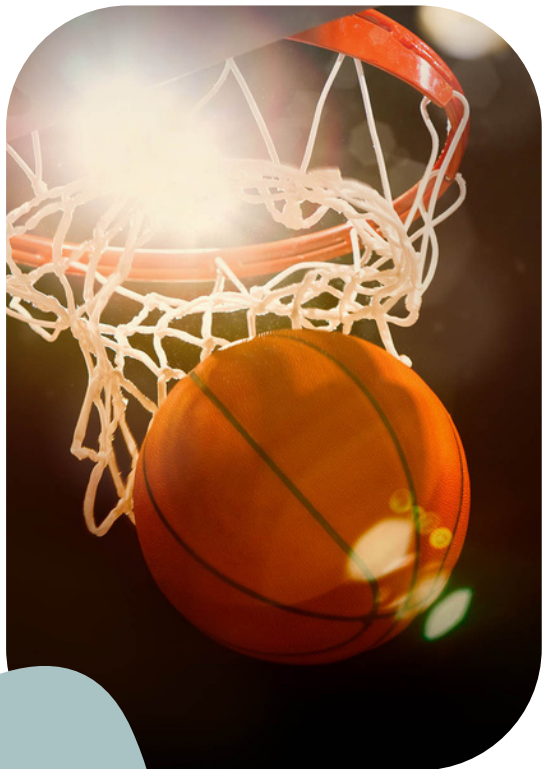
I'd like to thank Marie Schoenmaker who answered the call to come on board as our treasurer and has stepped into the role flawlessly.

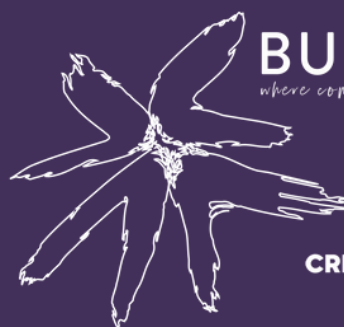

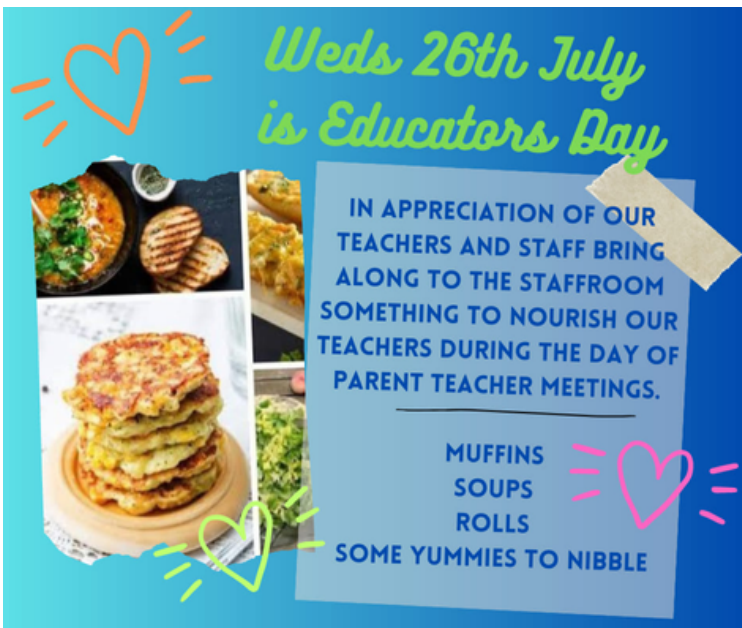
